Of course, the pinnacle of this grand truth is found in the passion and cross of our Lord. Growing in faith in these truths, we can face difficulty and evil with trust in our God. Growing in faith, we will find ourselves asking our God to bring good out of the evil we face in our own lives.

God is good, all the time. Mankind, not so much! God is good, all the time. That's why we come to worship Him each weekend and even twice a week in the season of Lent. God is good, all the time. He always tells us the truth, always leads us in the paths of righteousness, and His love for us in Christ never fails.

# “You Meant it for Evil, but God Meant it for Good”

Lenten Sermon Series  
The Year of our Lord, 2022

Joseph was one of twelve brothers, the favorite son of his father, Jacob, who was renamed “Israel” by God. Joseph, as we heard just a couple of weeks ago had some “tough shoes to fill.” He was blessed early in his life, but then faced the malice of his envious brothers and was sold into slavery in Egypt. He went through many difficult days, but reconciled with his brothers at the end of the book of Genesis.

ECCLESIASTES 3:20

“You meant it for evil, but God meant it for good,” are some of the words Joseph spoke to his brothers when they were reconciled to him. These words form the theme of our Lenten journey this year. We will look at different parts of Christ’s passion over the coming weeks, understanding that many things happened to Jesus that people certainly “meant for evil.” Yet, God, our Father in heaven, He “meant it for good . . . for the saving of many lives.” The weekly themes for Wednesday services are as follows:

# Generations United in All Things As Stewards

## *A Report from the Board of Stewardship*

This past fall our Board of Stewardship sponsored a stewardship emphasis covering several aspects of the Christian's responsibility when it comes to joyfully managing all of the gifts our God gives us in life. We had hoped the report would have been in the January Herald, but due to many circumstances it comes a bit later.

The stewardship emphasis concluded with the opportunity to bring in a commitment card regarding the desire to be intentional stewards of all life's gifts. A total of 77 people made formal commitments. Here is the tally of those commitments:

### **I Commit To Be Faithful In My Relationships**

I will pray for my family and loved ones regularly: **70**

I will invite back to worship people I know who have strayed: **58**

I will pray for courage to share my faith with others: **70**

### **I Commit To Be Faithful In My Spiritual Life**

Those 77 people committed to a total of 1330 minutes per day in personal Bible reading and devotion in prayer. That's an average of **17 minutes** per person per day

I will attend a group Bible study regularly: **30**.

I will faithfully worship at Church: **3.5** times per month on average.

### **I Commit To Be Faithful In My Spiritual Life**

Members' weekly commitments totaled \$1,785 per week; yearly total of \$92,820

Members' monthly commitments totaled \$9,053 per month; for a yearly total of \$108,636

Members' yearly commitments totaled \$67,700 for the year

Total commitment amounts for the year in all categories totals \$269,156.

Average of commitments per month: \$22,429.67

Average of commitments per week: \$5,176.08

A big thank you to the Board of Stewardship for their hard work. We also give thanks to God for all who participated both in spirit and in the formal way of making a commitment.

With the new school year underway in Guatemala, it's time for an update on our sponsored students. As you know, St. Paul's congregation has been providing tuition assistance to 3 students since 2012. Sadly, due to family issues and poor grades, 2 of the 3 (Yeymi and Santos) are no longer in the program. Cristino continues to thrive, and will begin high school this year. He will choose a major area of interest that will tie into a career path.

And, thanks to your generosity, we are able to sponsor 3 new students this year:

Yovani Alexander lives in El Rincon. He will begin high school at a private school, studying technical drawing. He has been in the scholarship program for years, but needs additional assistance due to the cost of equipment and materials. He has two other sponsors.

Nashly Yulisa is new to the Groundwork sponsorship program, although she has an older sister who is sponsored. Nashly is 9 years old, entering third grade. St. Paul's will be her sole sponsor.

Keny Abel is new to the program, and will be a high school senior. On his application, his mother wrote, "I come before you begging for help. I have a lot of need. My husband is a senior citizen. In this situation of the pandemic, they took his job away from him. My children need to finish their studies, and we do not have the money. May God bless you." Keny has 1 more year of high school left, and with all the hard work he has put in, Groundwork wanted him to have the opportunity to finish school. We will be his sole sponsor.

# Sharing God's Bounty

## What Have I Done for Him?

Lent is a season in the church year during which we particularly focus on the sacrifice Jesus made for us to pay the debt we owed for our sin. We know there is no way we can pay the debt ourselves. Only the sinless Son of God could do that. We have access to heaven only by grace through faith in Christ Jesus.

While we cannot repay Jesus for what he has done for us, his love does require a response. Paul, speaking of our ministry of reconciliation, wrote, *"For Christ's love compels us . . ."* (2 Corinthians 5:14). We remain on earth to carry out the tasks which Christ left for us to do: to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, care for the sick, and visit the prisoner, (Matthew 25:31-46). James admonished us that *" . . . faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead"* (James 2:17). We provide the funds that support our pastors, teachers, and missionaries. Again, we can quote Paul writing in 1 Corinthians 9:11-12. *"If we have sown spiritual seed among you, is it too much if we reap a material harvest from you? If others have this right of support from you, shouldn't we have it all the more?"* Certainly each of us is addressed by the Great Commission: *"Go and make disciples of all nations . . ."* (Matthew 28:19). The following words from Frances Ridley Havergal are a poignant reminder that Christ's love and sacrifice for us require a response:

*Thy life was given for me, Thy Blood, O Lord, was shed  
That I might ransomed by, and quickened from the dead.  
Thy life was given for me, What have I given for Thee?*

*And Thou hast brought to me Down from Thy home above  
Salvation full and free, Thy pardon and Thy love.*

*Great gifts Thou broughtest me, What have I brought to Thee?*

We are saved by grace through faith for works. Let us pray for the desire to be good stewards of the gifts of salvation, health and wealth, and time and opportunity which God has given us that we might have a part in the furthering of God's kingdom.

*We need not give up the pleasures and luxuries of this life. God does not call us to be ascetics, but he does call us to a right sense of proportion in administering our substance.*

*The question is: "If I have this for myself, then what should I do for God?" This is the question into which the whole matter of stewardship resolves itself.*



Dear Members of St. Pauls,






