

Sharing God's Bounty

Rejoice in the Lord

Psalm 104 recounts the wonders of God, talking about his creation and sustenance of the earth. What might the psalmist be thinking about as he composes this hymn of praise? Perhaps he was lying on his back on a beautiful, warm day, looking at a sun-filled sky. He starts to ponder the vastness of blue, and, as he does, he cannot help but break into praise. His thoughts shift from the beauty of the heavens to the wonder of the seas and their depths. Then he focuses more immediately on how God provides for all that he has made. The more he praises God, the more reasons he thinks of to continue doing so.

The beauty of nature can bring about such feelings of awe in us. Like the psalmist, we should give credit to the Creator and praise him for his works of such beauty and wonder.

But what about the cloudy days, the days when the sun doesn't break through, the days when cold winds blow through our souls, the days when the future looks bleak? At those times, our feelings of praise are not found within us. Instead of being compelled to break into songs of thanksgiving, we may break into complaining.

The psalmist says, *"I will sing to the Lord all my life; I will sing praise to my God as long as I live"* (verse 33). Our praise is not the result of our feelings but rather in response to God for all he has done. Our praises resound all our lives – the sunny and the cloudy days. Our praises continue because they emanate, not from the sun, but from the Son and flow back to him again.

Creator God, we look around ourselves and see the wonder of your work. Help us never to take for granted the beauty with which you surround us. Thank you for the even greater work you have done within us as you have given us eternal, spiritual life in your Son. Give us such gratitude that we cannot but help breaking into praise and telling others about what you have done for and in us. Through Christ we pray. Amen.

Are the majority of Christians in the world today really aware of the simple and sometimes difficult needs of others, as Jesus had been?

Opportunities to serve are all around us. In our churches, volunteers can commit to being a disciple of Christ by willingly giving of their time and talent.

Journey With Jesus



“U-Turn/ No U-Turn”

“Turn from evil and do good, seek peace and pursue it...” Psalm 34:14

We are used to seeing **No U-Turn** signs; the **U-Turn** sign is less common. Both are advisory/caution signs, warning of possible danger either if we stay on our present course (**no U-Turn**), or if we reverse course (**U-Turn**).

We encounter many **U-Turn** or **No U-Turn** situations on our life journey, involving our relationships (to God, friends, family), activities (habits, work life, use of time and talents), and behaviors (God pleasing or other pleasing?). Our moral compass should prompt us to ask, are we on the right track, no **U-Turn** required? Or, is there need for improvement, where a **U-Turn** is in order? Unfortunately, pride and complacency often lead us to accept the status quo, rather than taking a deep introspective look at ourselves; it is at our own peril that we neglect the need for personal **U-Turns**.

Some scriptural **U-Turn** and **No U-Turn** examples and their consequences:

Luke 19: 1-9: After Jesus calls the dishonest tax-collector Zacchaeus out of the Sycamore tree and visits his home. Zacchaeus does a U-Turn and repays those he has cheated!

Mark 10: 17-22: Jesus tells the Rich Young Ruler that he must sell all he has and give to the poor if he wants to inherit eternal life. The young man chooses **No U-Turn**, sacrificing eternal heavenly blessings for earthly treasure.

Acts 9: 1-17: Saul heads for Damascus, intent on persecuting believers, **No U-Turns** planned. But after Jesus appears to him, he takes the greatest **U-Turn** in history and is transformed from Greatest Persecutor to Greatest Evangelist!

Did you notice? The Rich Young Ruler could not accept Jesus' answer and walked away. Zacchaeus and Saul established relationships with Jesus, changing the direction of their lives forever and for good.

STOP: Take inventory of your relationships, activities, and behaviors. Identify specific items that are not God-pleasing, and should be changed.

SLOW: Strengthen and deepen you relationship with your Savior. Turn to Jesus for forgiveness and trust his guidance in changing your behaviors.

GO: Resolve to change items in your inventory, one at a time. Make a specific plan to accomplish the change. If applicable, make amends to anyone who has been hurt by your behavior. Return to Jesus regularly to maintain your determination to change.


Groundwork Guatemala News

Your Groundwork Guatemala team has been meeting biweekly since September, preparing for our trip next March. Having 5 new members (Pastor Noah, Diane Blank, Ken and Lori Moy, and Sue Vilter) has brought a lot of excitement as we build a new team. We've worked through many of their practical questions (such as: Really, we don't eat meat for the whole week? Really, we carry all our clothes and personal stuff in a small carry on? Really, only 1 shower for 6 women to share?) etc. We've shared devotions and prayers and "highs and lows" of our days.

Now that we've gotten to know each other, we have dived into the practicalities of teaching a faith lesson to kids, teens and adults, and developing craft projects for the kids. Our assigned scripture is Jesus teaching the disciples how to pray, with the Our Father/Lord's Prayer as our focus and memory verse. Creative juices are flowing, and we welcome any suggestions you may have!

Fundraising:

1. On November 1, your Groundwork team will host a restaurant dinner at **Big Deal Burgers** on 84th and Greenfield. Plan to come and enjoy their wide variety of burgers, sandwiches, fish fry, custard, etc. from 4:00 – 8:30pm; the team will receive a percentage of sales. No flyer is needed, but mention you are from St. Paul's.



2. **Coffee Sales:** You may order Godoy's Organic Guatemalan Coffee and chocolate coffee beans through November 24. Delivery will be late November, in time for Christmas giving. Order sheets will be at the Welcome table in the Narthex.



Tuition: St. Paul's continues to sponsor children to attend Christian School in Guatemala. Last year, we were able to share the joy of one of our students, Bryan, who graduated from high school and obtained work in telecommunications industry. Our younger kids are now in "Basicos," roughly equivalent to our Junior High, and continue to rely on our support. There will be a door offering after services the weekend of November 9-10, and we ask for your generous donations.

In-Kind Donations: THANKS to all of you who have contributed school supplies and health/hygiene products which we will carry with us to Guatemala. We have a good start, but continue to need your donations. Groundwork Guatemala currently sponsors nearly 300 children to go to school, and that includes providing the needed notebooks, pen/pencils, markers, etc. They also distribute about 15,000 vitamins to adults and kids, and about 5000 prenatal vitamins each month, as well as tooth paste, deodorant, allergy meds, antibiotics, etc. Donation baskets and lists of needed items are located in the narthex and near the 1st floor elevator. Please continue to generously supply these needed items!

Thank You for your continued interest and support of the Groundwork Guatemala Mission Team. As always, we ask for your prayers for the success of the team.
